Information Science/Business Applications program prepares graduates for careers for business that requires knowledge of modern methods and techniques of handling information/data as applied to commercial systems. The course of study includes both the business and technical aspects of information systems. Graduates are prepared to enter business careers as computer operators, programmers, or programmer/analysts in computer centers in business, government, institutions, and agencies.

The recommended sequence for full-time student is listed below. Part-time students may elect to schedule classes at their own pace, through day-time, evening/or Saturday classes.
